How can puppets be beneficial to children with dyspraxia?

The fine movement required to wear a puppet helps with dexterity and using fingers to manipulate the puppet improves fine motor coordination. Marionettes or string puppets help with eye-hand coordination as the puppet is made to walk and move in different directions.

How to Use Finger Puppets to Teach Children with Autism: Use finger puppets with children's songs, build communication skills, build fine motor skills, build imitation skills, role play, build attention skills, and work on increasing eye contact.
